For the month of October, overall it was a good month. A lot of the larceny from autos and mail box thefts were related and the suspect was arrested last week.

Our Stats are as follows:

1 Robbery (Individual)

The mailbox thief in East Beach was arrested and is in Jail. USPS will be filing Federal charges this week.

## **Updates:**

The city had planned to replace the water and sewer lines of 16, 17 and 18<sup>th</sup> Bay Street this year. In January we asked why they were not also replacing the stormwater lines that sat under the water and sewer lines. The city said they were 2 separate departments. I called a meeting with the help of Andrea McClellan and it was decided then that 16, 17 & 18<sup>th</sup> would be a TEST project and they would replace all three lines at the same time (same hole- 3 lines!). I am pleased to announce the 2 departments have finally worked out the protocol of how to work together on this project and they are now ready to move forward with planning this project on the 3 Bay streets from Pleasant Ave to Pretty Lake. Construction may be able to start next summer.

There will be a HUGE Recycling event on Saturday: November 14<sup>th</sup> 9am – noon. ONE STOP SHOP! It will be at the Workforce Development Center, 201 E. Little Creek Rd. Flier is on website. They will take just about EVERYTHING: paper shredding, household hazardous waste, plastic bags, Pesticides, Mercury items like fluorescent bulbs, batteries, automotive products, paint and flammable products.

The Newsletter is going to press this week. It will be on the website by Monday and probably back from the printers and distributed to advertisers in about 2 weeks.

I will have a new development presentation next month from EDC if they get the information to the Board in time for next months meeting.

Starting this Friday, November 6<sup>th</sup>, and continuing through next Friday, November 13<sup>th</sup>, *weather permitting*, asphalt pavement milling (grinding) and repaving will take place along the project corridor where the old Flyover Bridge used to be. During milling and repaving activities, temporary traffic patterns can be expected on week days between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m.:
